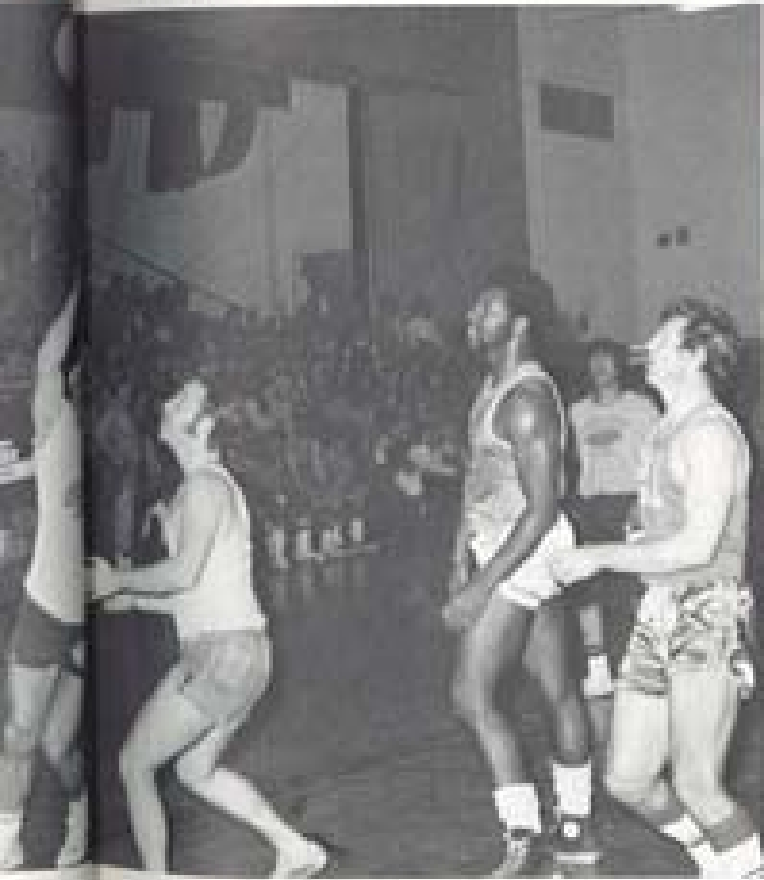
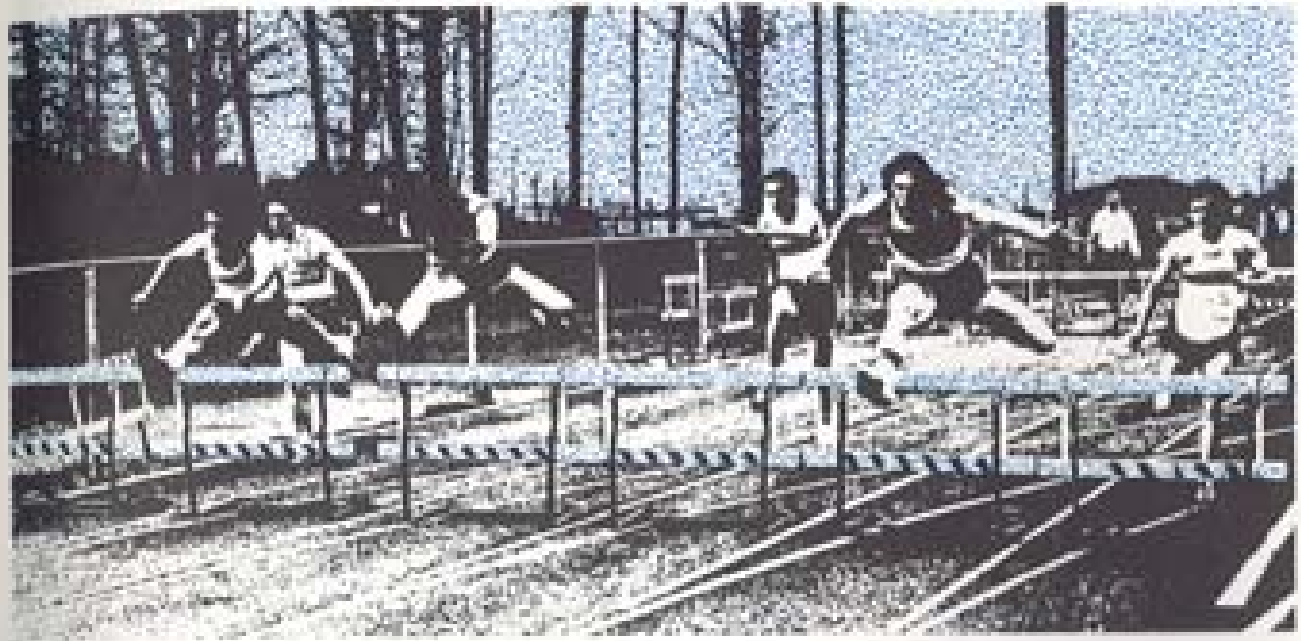






















Academics

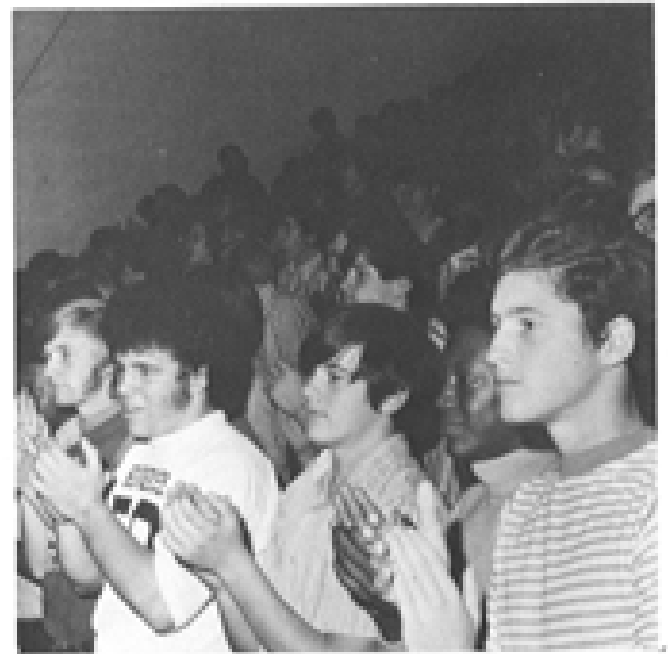

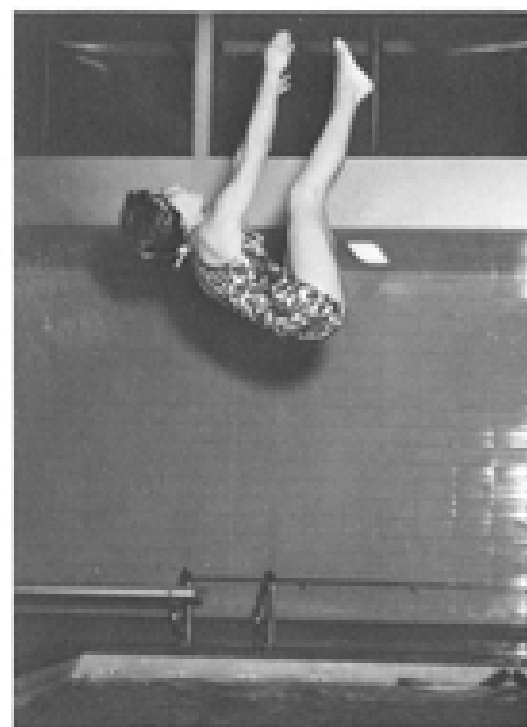

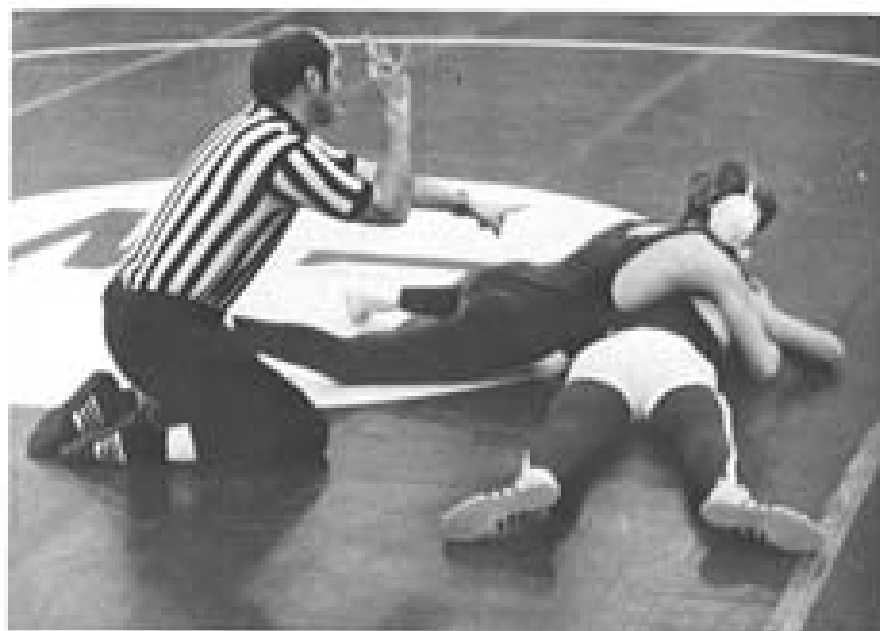

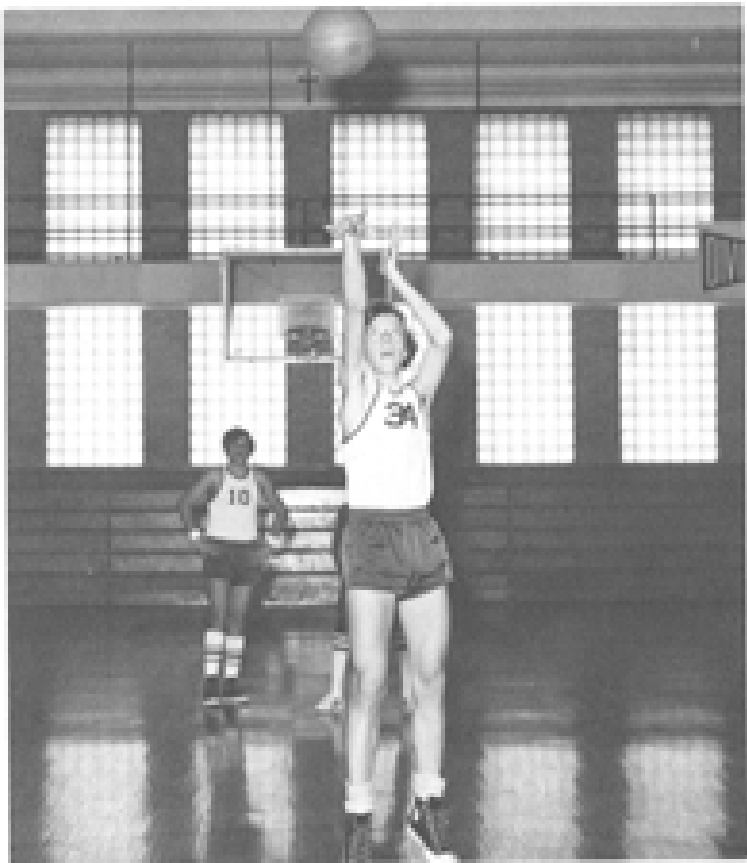

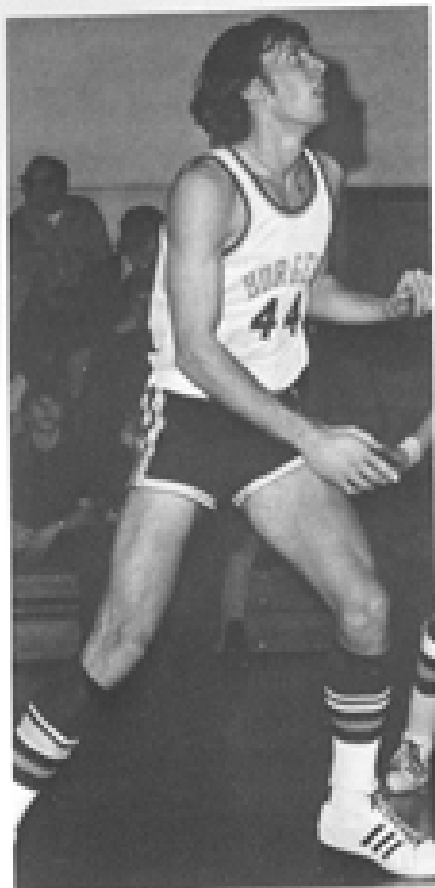

The Freshmen were the first class at Borgess to have an enrollment exceeding 450 students. But the Sophomores, Juniors and Seniors saw them as 'more kids to whom one could sell elevator passes and swimming pool privileges'.

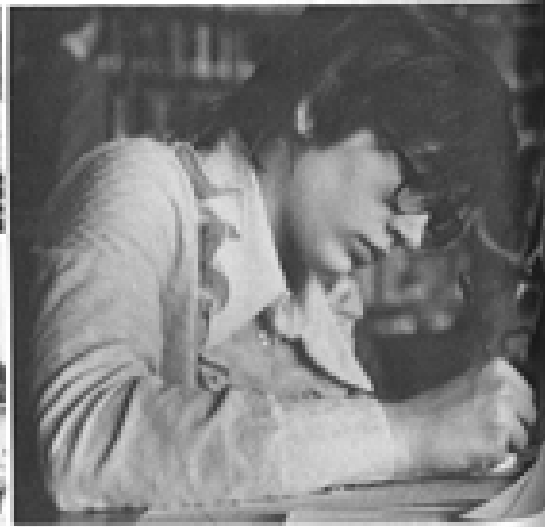
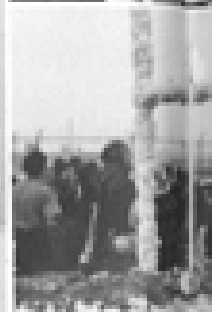
Just when the Freshmen thought their initiation was over, along came 'Freshy Friday'. However, because no one knew exactly what date had been selected, three consecutive Fridays found the Freshmen dodging everyone.

In spite of all the harassment the Freshmen endured, or perhaps, because of it, they proved beyond a doubt that they were spirited. During the Dad's Club raffle the Class of 76 sold more tickets than any other class. They continued to support every activity and sponsored their first dance "You are the Sunshine of My Life" in May. Their charity project consisted of collecting food for those in need.

The Sophomore charity project involved the painting of a flat which was then furnished by the class. This along with the traditionally sponsored Junior Ring Breakfast was financed by two rollerskating parties and the dance "We Can Make It Happen".

Two new concepts of entertainment at Borgess, Pizza Nite and Nostalgia Week, were introduced by the Class of 74. For a nominal fee students were given two pieces of pizza, pop, and good dance music during Pizza Night. Throughout Nostalgia Week various contests were held testing students' skills with the hula-hoop, the limbo bar, and Volkswagens. On Friday of the festive week a dance was given which offered two bands playing music from the '50's and the '70's. The Juniors were the recipients of a breakfast of sausages and pancakes on May 23. At the same time, they received their rings and were given awards which recognized academic achievement performed during the year. The Class of 74 also sponsored the Senior Brunch.

June 6, 1973 the last final exam for the 1972-73 school year was taken, and the Classes of 74, 75 and 76 were freed . . . for the summer. It has been a year of busy activity for everyone, and has kept us all on our toes.
